The winners of the competition won a prize of Rs. 750 and the first runner up won a prize 600 each. The whole classroom was charged with fervor and enthusiasm. The event received a thunderous response from the participants as well as the audience.

#### 'THE WEAKEST LINK'

The Planning Forum of NM College organized its second event titled 'The Weakest Link' on Friday i.e.  $30^{th}$  August, 2013 in Room No. 5 at 10:40 a.m. Right from the beginning, all the members of the Planning Forum put in a lot of hard work and perseverance in conducting the event. The members of the Planning Forum were inspired by the popular U.K. based reality show 'The Weakest Link'.

The total number of teams who participated in the event were 32. Each team comprised of two students. The event was basically divided into two rounds-the First Round was the Elimination Round where 7 teams were selected out of the 34 teams present.

The participants in the First Round had to solve questions based on Logic and General Knowledge. Questions were asked on a variety of subjects, including Current affairs, technology, Sports, National/International History and Geography, Literature, Corporate world. Also, some questions tested the students' knowledge about the college. The Second Round was a Rapid Fire Round at the end of which 'the weakest link', was voted out & eliminated by the contestants. In each round the contestants had an opportunity to Bank the cash prize for a question answered correctly. A cash price of Rs. 720 was awarded to the winner of the competition.
