NSS members actively worked to facilitate the Voter ID registration booth in Narsee Monjee College; where registrations were submitted from 25th to 27th September. This initiative was warmly welcomed by all and appreciation was expressed regarding NM NSS’s endeavor to bring about a positive change in the attitude of today’s youth.

NSS Camp

This year,the camp was conducted at Ashram Shala, Padghe(Umroli) to widen the horizons of school children. We had a clothes donation drive and distributed clothes to the students there. Because of the tremendous response shown by the students of our college to come forth and donate clothes that they no longer use we even had sufficient

clothes to donate to Goonj (an NGO that distributes clothes among underprivileged children).

The children of the school at umroli were trained in 4 sports: chess, football, volleyball & badminton. They were also taught creativity in embroidery, origami, use of scrap materials etc. A skit was shown to the children that covered abuse of women to abortion of a female child. A session was conducted with the children to explain the topic of “Good touch Bad Touch” which educated the children on what steps are to be taken in the case of someone taking advantage of their modesty. Our efforts were much appreciated by the school faculty, students as well as the Sarpanch of the taluka.

We sold plants like Tulsi, Adulsa, Ajwain and Alovira and took oath from the buyer that they would take care of the plant they are buying.
