Listening:

- **Objective:** To enhance students' active listening skills by engaging them in exercises that emphasize the importance of attentive listening in effective communication. The activity focuses on teaching students to listen with empathy, patience, and without judgment.
- **Outcome:** Students will demonstrate improved listening abilities, including the capacity to paraphrase, ask relevant questions, and provide constructive feedback, which will foster better understanding and communication in their interactions.

Social & Cultural Etiquette:

- **Objective:** To educate students on the norms and practices of social and cultural etiquette, helping them to navigate diverse social situations with confidence and respect. This activity aims to increase students' awareness of different cultural contexts and appropriate behavior.
- **Outcome:** Students will gain a better understanding of various social and cultural etiquettes, enabling them to interact more respectfully and effectively in multicultural environments, thus enhancing their interpersonal skills and cultural competence

Problem solving, Critical thinking, Logical reasoning & Decision making

- **Objective:** The objective is to equip students with critical thinking and problem-solving skills to analyze real-world issues, evaluate multiple perspectives, structure logical arguments, and make informed decisions. By engaging in practical applications, students will enhance their ability to think systematically, assess options rationally, and develop well-reasoned judgments in various contexts.
- **Outcome:** Students successfully applied structured problem-solving methods, critically assessed data and arguments, utilized logical frameworks for evaluation, and demonstrated proficiency in making strategic decisions. Their ability to analyze issues, consider diverse viewpoints, and make sound judgments reflects their enhanced problem-solving and decision-making capabilities.



Indian Languages

In the academic year 2024-25, under NEP, the college undertook a significant curricular reform by integrating four Indian languages – Marathi, Hindi, Gujarati and Sanskrit, into its academic program. This initiative was conceived with the dual objectives of promoting linguistic diversity and enriching the cultural milieu of the institution. The course aimed to deepen students' appreciation of India's linguistic heritage and foster greater engagement with the nation's multifaceted traditions.

The language courses were structured to be delivered over two semesters, allowing students second year students of BCOM and SFC to select one language from the four options. The curriculum for each language was meticulously designed to address foundational competencies in reading, writing, and speaking. Furthermore, the courses incorporated modules on the historical and cultural contexts of each language, thereby providing a holistic educational experience.

To accommodate varying levels of prior exposure, course materials were developed for both beginners and students with existing knowledge of the language. Instructional strategies included interactive lectures, language labs, and cultural immersion activities, which collectively enhanced the effectiveness of language acquisition.

The introduction of Indian languages into the curriculum yielded several positive outcomes:

- **Promotion of Multilingualism:** Students developed proficiency in an additional Indian language, thereby enhancing their linguistic repertoire.
- **Cultural Enrichment:** Engagement with language-specific literature, art, and traditions enabled students to gain a deeper understanding of India's diverse cultural landscape.
- **Strengthening of Identity:** The program fostered a stronger sense of regional and national identity among students, encouraging them to appreciate the pluralistic nature of Indian society.

The integration of Hindi, Gujarati, Sanskrit, and Marathi into the academic curriculum during 2024-25 proved to be a successful initiative. It not only advanced the college's commitment to linguistic and cultural diversity but also provided students with valuable skills and perspectives. The positive reception and tangible outcomes of the program underscore its significance as a model for promoting heritage languages in higher education.

The Training and Placement (T&P) Cell at Narsee Monjee College of Commerce and Economics continues its mission of enhancing student employability through structured training and strong industry connect. The academic year 2024-25 witnessed significant progress in both placement outcomes and pre-placement preparedness, highlighting the Cell's dedication to fostering professional growth among students.

Training and Skill Development

The T&P Cell prioritized holistic training across all levels. Pre-placement training for third-year students began in July 2024 and continued until February 2025, covering key streams including BMS, BAF, BFM, BCom (Economics), BCom (E&A), BCom (Honours), BSc IT, and MCom. Students were equipped with both individual and panel interview experiences, boosting their confidence and readiness for real-world challenges.

For second-year students, the Cell offered soft-skills modules such as Dispute Management, Stress Management, Team Building, and Preparedness for the Corporate World, and T&P Orientation. These were delivered across all major streams with impressive participation numbers, notably in BMS, BCom, BAF, and BSc IT. First-year students underwent foundational training in areas such as Becoming Proactive, Confidence Building, Emotional Regulation, Assertiveness, and Time Management—critical life skills for budding professionals.

Placement Achievements

The 2024-25 placement season was marked by active participation from over 35 top recruiters including Morgan Stanley, KPMG, Deloitte, EY, Barclays, Accenture, and Deutsche Bank. A total of **140 students were successfully placed** across undergraduate and postgraduate streams. The highest CTC offered was **₹14.1 LPA**, while the overall **median salary stood at ₹5.33 LPA**.

Prominent placements include:

- **Morgan Stanley:** 13 students placed with a CTC of ₹5.3 LPA.
- **Deloitte:** 11 UG and PG students placed with packages up to ₹7.6 LPA.
- **KPMG, EY, and Tresvista:** Multiple students secured competitive roles in audit, analytics, and consulting.

The BMS stream saw the highest number of placements (34 students), followed by BSc IT (19), and BCom (23). Students also secured offers in niche roles such as analytics, digital marketing, and investment research, showcasing the diversity of opportunities available.



Conclusion

The T&P Cell's efforts in aligning academic training with industry expectations have yielded excellent results. From foundational soft-skills to rigorous interview prep and successful placements, the journey of 2024-25 reflects the College's commitment to excellence and student empowerment. With strong mentorship, corporate partnerships, and enthusiastic student engagement, the future of NM College's placements continues to look promising.

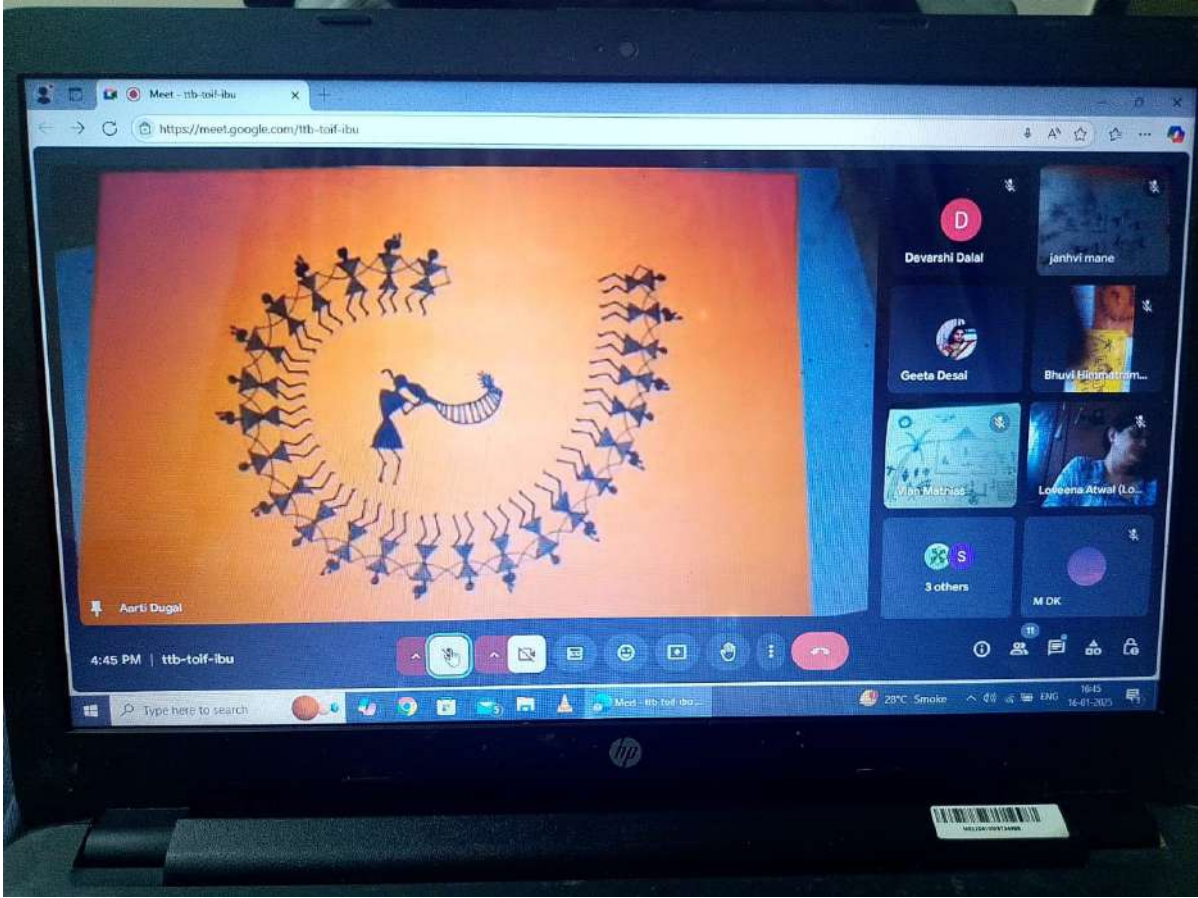

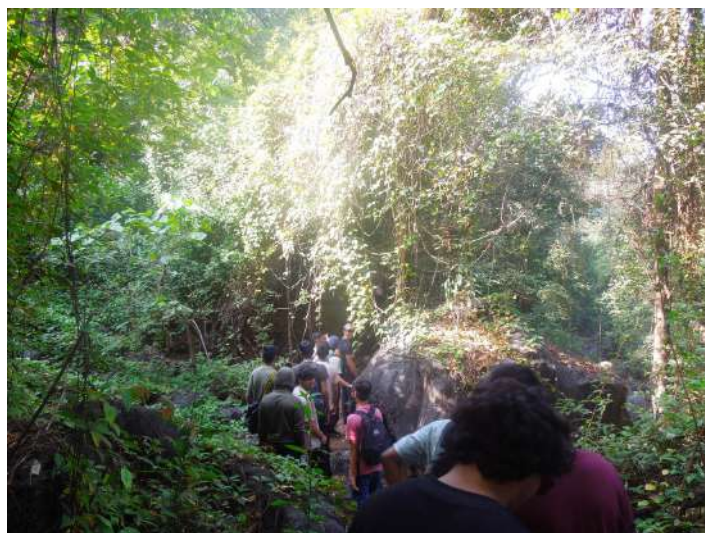

Through these initiatives, NMCCE continues to foster an environment where students celebrate language, culture, and teamwork, enhancing their educational journey with meaningful experiences.

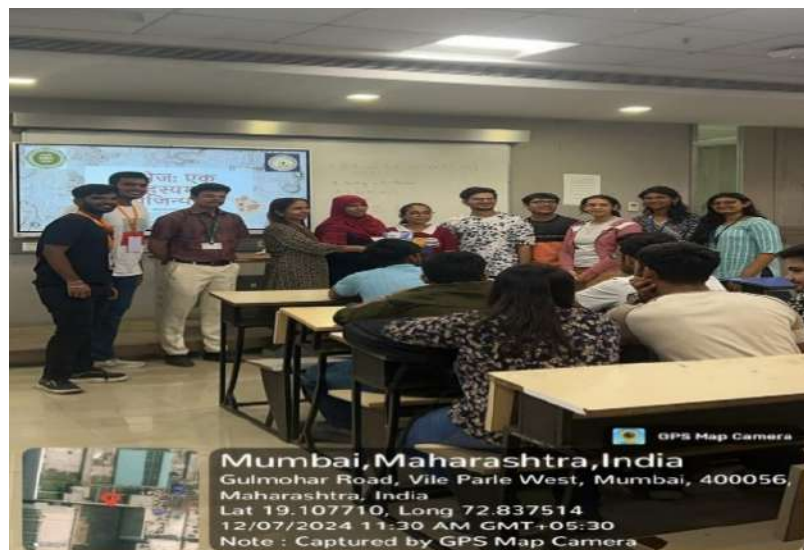
