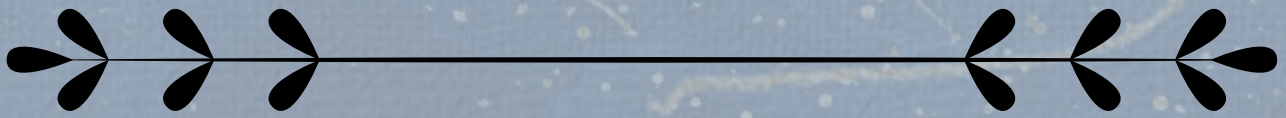

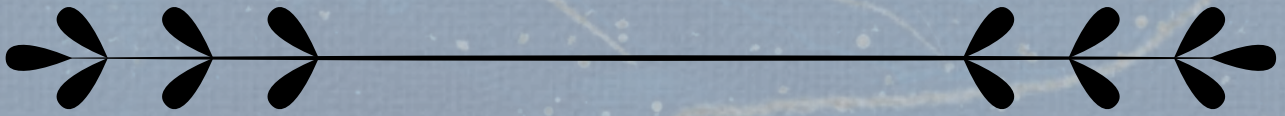

ABOUT NSS



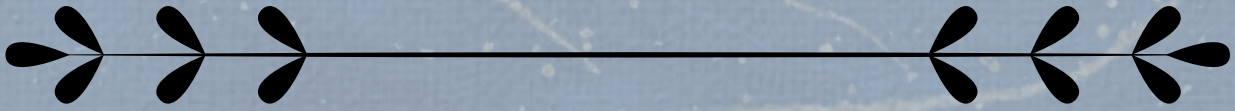

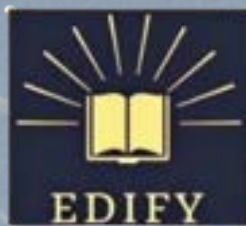

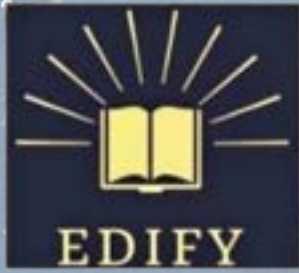


UNIVERSITY EVENTS

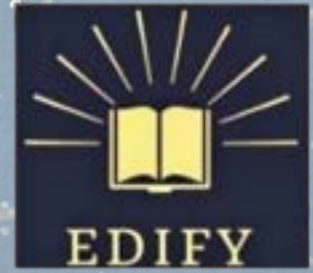

To achieve this, Sparv engages in a variety of initiatives including medical camps, donation drives, orphanage visits, and more. 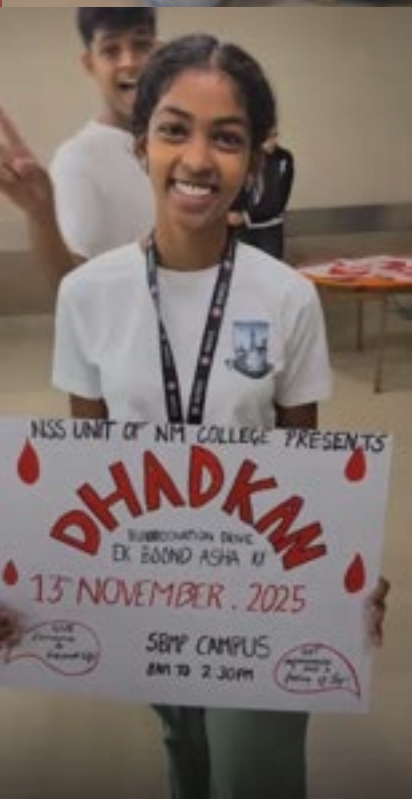
DHADKAN- BLOOD DONATION DRIVE

STEM CELL DONATION REGISTRATION DRIVE

Each year, millions of lives are lost globally to blood cancer. Yet, with the advancement of medical science, there is hope — stem cell donation has the potential to cure it.

With the support of a third-party organization, NMNSS organized a stem cell registration drive to contribute to this life-saving cause. Saliva samples were collected as part of the registration process. While finding a perfect stem cell match is rare, if a match is found, the donor may be called upon to donate blood-derived stem cells to help save a patient's life. This opportunity is available only up to the age of 50. The drive was open to all, and it saw a large number of enthusiastic participants — from NMNSS volunteers to students across the college — coming forward to register and make a difference.



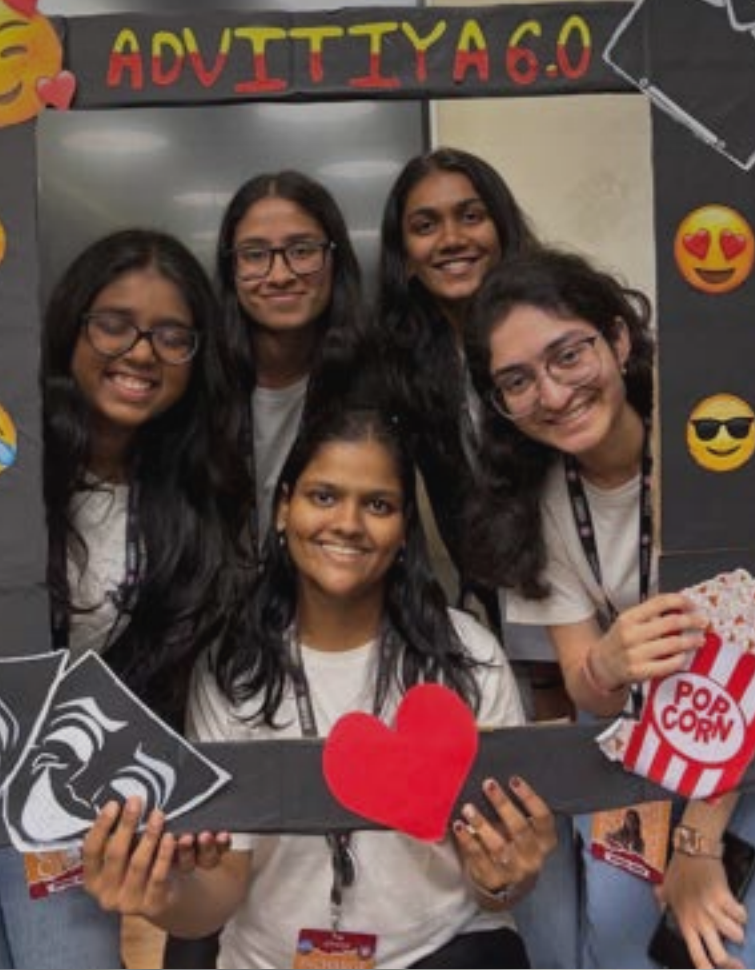
